Academic Achievement of Enrolling Students

NC State's 2015 freshman class is the highest achieving class in our history. With an overwhelming majority (79%) of our incoming students ranked in the top 20% of their class, there is no question that these 4,270 freshmen are highly prepared for life at NC State. The freshman class represents 98 of North Carolina's 100 counties, 44 of the 50 states and 31 countries.

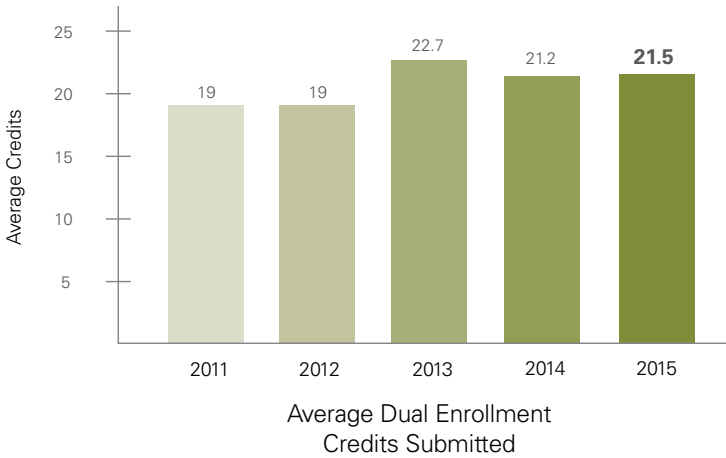

Dual Enrollment

High school students lead busy lives inside and outside of the classroom, yet many students find the time to enroll at local community colleges and universities while still enrolled in high school. For 2015, 876 incoming freshmen indicated that they took college courses during high school. On average, they took 21.5 college credit hours.



Advanced Placement Exams

NC State continues to see an increase in the number of AP exam scores submitted each year. This year, 74% of first-year students submitted, on average, 5.34 AP scores. Overall, 16,505 scores were submitted including 3,170 scores of a 5.
