Student Health Services Checklist

- › **Insurance:** Enroll into or waive out of the Student Health Insurance Plan by September 10, 2024.
- › **Immunizations:** Complete all required immunizations and upload to the HealthyPack Portal.
- › **TB Questionnaire:** Complete TB questionnaire online via HealthyPackPortal.
- › **Health History:** Complete Health History Form online via HealthyPackPortal.

- › **Get a Flu Shot:** Get your flu shot at one of our clinics on campus (September - January).

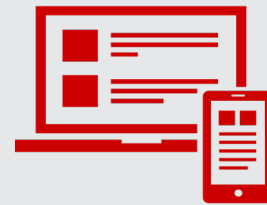
