- › **TB Questionnaire:** Complete TB questionnaire online via HealthyPackPortal.
- › **Health History:** Complete Health History Form online via HealthyPackPortal.
- › **Prescription Medications:** Transfer your prescriptions to Student Health Pharmacy by calling [919.515.5040](tel:919.515.5040).
- › **Get a Flu Shot:** Get your flu shot at one of our clinics on campus (September - January).
- › Visit [healthypack.dasa.ncsu.edu](http://healthypack.dasa.ncsu.edu) to access the HealthyPack Portal and learn more.

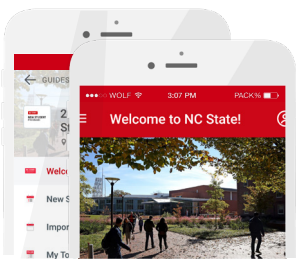

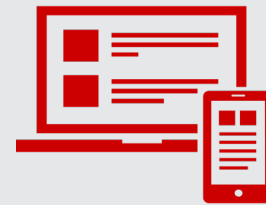
