NC State is located in downtown Raleigh, North Carolina, which blends the fun and excitement of a big city with the hospitality and charm of a small Southern town. North Carolina's capital city is located in the heart of the state's Triangle region, which is home to a number of other colleges and universities, and is minutes from world-renowned Research Triangle Park. ### **About New Student and Family Orientation**

New Student Orientation, a program that is required for all first-year and transfer students, helps students prepare for their transition into college life as well as the challenges and opportunities that lie ahead—intellectually, emotionally, academically, and socially. A concurrent Family Orientation program is offered for parents and family members so they can learn about University resources and processes.

- Twenty five first-year sessions for approximately 5,800 students and their families
- Five transfer sessions for approximately 1,600 students and their families
- Sessions are traditionally college or program based to introduce students to their academic home
- Student leadership includes approximately 36 Orientation Leaders and 4 returning Student Coordinators

#### QUALIFICATIONS

#### Required Experience & Skills:

- Completed at least one year of a master's program in higher education, student affairs, college student personnel, or a similar field
- Previous experience advising and/or supervising students
- Ability to work independently and as part of a highly collaborative team of professionals and student leaders
- Actively fosters a welcoming culture for students and families

#### **Preferred Experience & Skills:**

- Previous experience in orientation or transition programs
- Previous experience in program or event planning
- > Excellent written and oral communication skills
- Attention to detail and the ability to multi-task in a fast-paced environment
- Previous experience in student leader or employee training and development

Above all, candidates should possess flexibility and a desire to learn and grow from the internship experience.





#### ORIENTATION INTERN

#### Responsibilities

The responsibilities listed below are not exhaustive and may be split amongst the selected intern team.

- ASSIST with the implementation of a comprehensive schedule of orientation programs including 25 first-year student sessions, 5 transfer student sessions, and concurrent family programs
- CO-SUPERVISE a team of Orientation Leaders and Student Coordinators under a model of team supervision
- FACILITATE student leader training sessions for Orientation Leaders and Student Coordinators
- PROVIDE on-site assistance to new students and campus partners in various capacities
- COLLABORATE on the daily creation of staff work schedules
- > COORDINATE aspects of student staff assessment and lead individual evaluation meetings
- PLAN and execute student staff community building events, including Orientation Leader graduation and the end-of-summer banquet
- COORDINATE with campus partners to implement technical aspects of orientation presentations
- PRESENT at orientation events for new students and families

#### **Benefits**

- > Earn approximately \$8,000 over the summer at a rate of \$16.00/hour (40 hours/week with some evening and weekend obligations)
  - Eligible for overtime for any hours over 40 per week
- > ON-CAMPUS HOUSING (Not Required)
- MEALS will be provided to interns during orientation sessions
- OPPORTUNITY to meet with campus partners and other colleges and universities in the area based on their goals and interests

All new hires at the university are contingent upon Chancellor approval and budget availability.



#### **TIME COMMITMENT**

Move-In: Tuesday, May 13

**Graduate Intern Training:** Wednesday, May 14 - Friday, May 23

- Typically 8:30 a.m. 5:00 p.m.
- Do not have to work weekends/holidays

Student Coordinator Training: Wednesday, May 21 - Friday, May 30

- Typically 8:30 a.m. 5:00 p.m.
- Do not have to work weekends/holidays

Orientation Leader Training: Sunday, June 1 - Monday, June 9

- Typically 8:00 a.m. 5:00 p.m.
- Some evening and weekend obligations required

Orientation Sessions: Tuesday, June 10 - Thursday, July 31

- 45 hours per week (approximate) with number of hours ranging from 30 per week to 50 per week depending on the orientation calendar
- Some evenings, including one night per week (5:30-9:30 p.m.)

Anticipated End Date & Move-Out: Friday, August 1

Please note, all time frames above are tentative and subject to change based on Orientation planning. Any changes will be discussed and communicated in a timely manner.
