Now that your student is enrolled at NC State, their personal record is confidential according to the federal law called the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA). If your student wishes to grant you access to their records for things like assisting with bill payment, they must follow the steps provided online at go.ncsu.edu/parentaccess.

Fall semester tuition and fees are available to view beginning July 3, 2026 and are due July 24, 2026.

New Student Checklist

By NOT completing the following steps, a hold could be placed on your account or your fall semester schedule could be dropped:

□ Pay Your Bill

- › Fall semester tuition and fees are due July 24, 2026. Learn more about payment options and parental access for bill payment at studentservices.ncsu.edu.

□ Submit Final Transcripts

- › Students must provide NC State with final transcripts of their academic coursework from their previous institutions.
- › **Mail to:** NC State Office of Undergraduate Admissions, Campus Box 7103, Raleigh, NC 27695-7103

□ Student Health Services Checklist

- › **Insurance:** Enroll into or waive out of the Student Health Insurance Plan by September 10, 2026.
- › **Immunizations:** Complete all required immunizations and upload to the HealthyPack Portal.
- › **TB Questionnaire:** Complete TB questionnaire online via HealthyPackPortal.
- › **Health History:** Complete Health History Form online via HealthyPackPortal.
- › **Prescription Medications:** Transfer your prescriptions to Student Health Pharmacy by calling [919.515.5040](tel:919.515.5040).
- › **Get a Flu Shot:** Get your flu shot at one of our clinics on campus (September - January).
- › Visit healthypack.dasa.ncsu.edu to access the HealthyPack Portal and learn more.

□ Update Your Contact Information

- › Update your phone and address information with the university via MyPack Portal. Once you've logged in, go to Student Homepage > Personal Information > Addresses or Contact Details.
- › Sign up to receive WolfAlert emergency text messages by adding your cell number.

□ Check Your Email Frequently
